History 101

While in search of old Hastings photos and post cards, I encountered a few identified as Oak Point, Hastings. Where is "Oak Point"? I recently found out it is in the area now known as Trentwood Estates, located on the south shore of the Trent River, across from Dreamland and Stoney Point resorts.

Since then I have found Oak Point on local maps given out by nearby restaurants and tourist information centres. Trentwood now consists of about 35 privately owned dwellings located along Lakeshore Drive and Trillium Lane beside the Trent River. When looking for it on an online map or GPS, you often have to search Trent Hills instead of Hastings.

In the past, Trentwood was called "Camp Jordan". In 1946 the name Trentwood was introduced and it consisted of a group of rental cabins named after different trees like Cedar, Maple and Oak. It was a haven for American tourists, especially from Ohio, offering fishing guides, lodging, meals and boat shuttle service from the Hastings train station. I did find a comprehensive brochure from 1946 picturing Al Sriver, with his fishing catch, on the front cover. The dining room offered breakfast for \$1 and dinner for \$1.50.

Trentwood Estates, located at Oak Point on the Trent River near Hastings, is a real Trent Hills gem!

Animal Crackers

Every March, off the coast of Vancouver Island, approximately 20,000 gray whales pass the island on their way to the Bering Sea.
